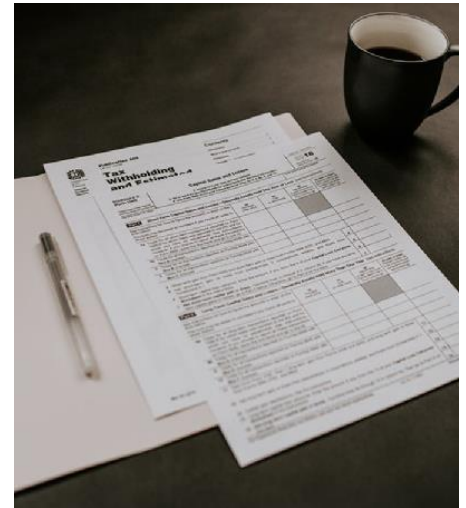


# Meet Jason Valiante
